Tuesday, 09.08.:

Title: "Deutsche Bahn (German Railways) in Mexico: Ecocide and Displacement".

Time slot: 09.08., 14:30 - 16 p.m.

Organization: Gira Zapatista Networking Hamburg

Language: German

Description: Lecture on the participation of European corporations (esp. Deutsche Bahn) in the mega-project "Tren Maya" in southern Mexico and the resistance there. Based on the research "Tren Maya Made in Germany", the impact on nature, border regime and population in the affected areas will be discussed. Followed by an open discussion about options for practical solidarity.

Title: "Cycle/Gender Equity Workshop."

Description: In order to create gender justice it is necessary to understand how the realities of life differ between the genders. Among other things, the monthly cycle has a great influence on this, which, together with menstruation, is still a taboo topic. In this workshop we want to break the taboo and talk about how the hormonal cycle works, how it affects mood and experience, and how natural and hormonal contraception works.

Description: In the workshop "Autonomo Feminist Organizing" we want to deal with the questions why we want to and why we should organize autonomously as FLINTA* also in all-gender groups and why we see in it a form of self-defense in patriarchy. We also want to reflect together on what is currently preventing us from doing so. How do we stand in our own way? Which patriarchal dynamics between us, with our friends, distance us from each other? But we also want to talk about how we can overcome these obstacles. What ways and tools can we find to strengthen ourselves, to come together? What have we learned and experienced in our biography that also connects us with each other? How do we need to organize to bring down patriarchy? In order to discuss these questions we also want to look at the women's revolution in Rojava and use their autonomous organizing and self-defense as an inspiration that can also strengthen feminist movements in Germany.

Title: "Climate Crisis and Fascism"

Description: Climate crisis & shift to the right - movement, perspective, narratives - where are we, where are we going?

Summers of heat, forest fires and melting Arctic. At the same time, right-wing terror cells are uncovered again and again and the so-called lateral thinkers bring thousands of people onto the streets - in the middle of it all Reichkrieg-flags and Nazi slogans. How are these - at first sight so different - phenomena connected? In our workshop, we will take a closer look at both the shift to the right and the climate crisis. Expecting partly dystopian perspectives, we want to find out what warning signals we can find for this in today's society. We ask ourselves: Which positions and narratives of climate change make up right-wing actors today - from AfD to eco-fascism? Where do we encounter nationalist interpretations of nature conservation and who or what is the so-called "eco-right"? What is the relationship between capital, workers and fascism in a climate (un)just future? We want to work out together how we can meaningfully connect our struggles in the different movements and what perspectives are offered for a left activism.

Description: Where does our coffee come from, where is the world's largest warehouse for hand-knotted carpets hidden and why does the bitterly poor Liberia have one of the largest trading fleets? A behind-the-scenes journey of brick walls and container gantry cranes. It's about coffee and cocoa, soybeans and bananas, jeans and armaments.

Because before we can marvel at the enormous collection of goods on the shelves, all the individual parts have traveled enormous distances. Like in a fever dream, capitalism keeps everything in motion - everywhere, all the time. This movement is organized by logistics. It has turned the world into a global fossil factory. It has intensified environmental and climate destruction and perpetuates colonial history. This violent relationship is hidden in the containers of the port

of Hamburg.

The tour with the Port of Hamburg Group illustrates the background of world trade with Africa, Asia and Latin America. It explains why coffee and cocoa have become so cheap, why scrap metal is an export hit and who earns from the extremely unequal trade between North and South.

Through the interplay of personal letters, emotional recollections and factual information, the book enables an encounter with Ellen Stêrk after her death. Her story invites us to win utopias, to re-live internationalism, to organize, and to keep fighting. Collectively compiled from many perspectives, this biography also provides insights into the last decades of radical leftist references and feminist organizing approaches. Two members of the editors' collective will read from the book and talk about Ellen and the process of writing it.

Title: Hydrogen and climate justice (I): cornerstone of the energy transition or false solution?

Time slot: Aug. 10, 9:30 a.m. - 11 a.m.

Type: Workshop

Organization: critical scientists from Hamburg

Language: German

Description: Hydrogen is at the center of the European energy transition debate. For the hydrogen transition in Germany and the EU, large amounts of hydrogen imports from the global south are needed. Win-win narratives promise CO2 reductions, economic growth and independence from Russian natural gas in Europe in return for investments and development perspectives in the Global South. In this workshop, we will introduce the hydrogen debate: What is hydrogen and why does it come in different colors? Why is there a hype around hydrogen right now? What hydrogen strategies are industrialized countries pursuing? How are the advantages and disadvantages distributed in the emerging

global hydrogen economy? In addition, we want to explore the question of what the developments around hydrogen mean from a climate justice perspective. Is hydrogen an important element of a climate-just energy transition or a false solution? We do not assume any special prior knowledge. The workshop is a good preparation for the advanced workshop on hydrogen imports and energy coloniality.

Title: "The wrong path of nuclear power. On dangerous illusory debates"

Time slot: Aug. 10, 9:30 a.m.-11 a.m.

Type: Workshop

Language: German

Description: Nuclear power is a problem for the climate as well as for the security of supply - in view of radioactive dangers, uranium mining and nuclear waste anyway. But with the fear of missing gas, the discussion about nuclear power is back again. Conservative and right-wing voices in particular are using the discussion to create a mood, to distract attention from their own energy policy mistakes and, with the nuclear phase-out, also to call into question the energy transition as a whole. Under the pretext of climate protection, pro-nuclear forces are trying to gain influence in the climate movement as well. The workshop provides counter-arguments, discusses counter-strategies and offers space to network against lifetime extension debates and populist influence.

Title: "Privilege Workshop"

Language: German

Restrictions: 14 persons

Description: What are privileges actually? What do my privileges mean for me, for others and in the context of our whole society? How can I reflect on my privileges and find a good way to deal with them? We want to discuss this and many other questions together in this workshop.

The focus will be on emotional engagement with the topic, addressing difficult issues such as shame, guilt, and anger. Since privilege is a very broad field, we

will try to lay the foundations together to continue this work alone, in groups and in circles of friends. During the workshop we will of course take into account our own emotional capacities.

Title: "Start Smart Actions"

Title: "Hydrogen and Climate Justice (II): Imports and Energy Coloniality."

Time slot: 08/10, 11:30 a.m. - 1 p.m.

Type: Workshop

Organization: critical scientists from Hamburg and Berlin/Colombia

Languages: German & English

Description: The demand for green hydrogen is supposed to be covered by imports from countries of the Global South, especially Morocco, Namibia, Saudia Arabia, Chile or Brazil. In this advanced workshop, we take a closer look at the neocolonial dimension of the global hydrogen economy. To what extent is the search for hydrogen suppliers shaped by neocolonial patterns and aligned with the interests of green investors? What are the socio-ecological, economic and political implications? Are there protests and resistances against hydrogen projects? Are there also starting points for social movements and for emancipatory hydrogen futures? Together with you, we will first consider what we mean by energy coloniality and discuss this along case studies of hydrogen projects in Morocco, Namibia and DR Congo. In addition, we will consider what is important for energy transitions to be just, what a decolonial perspective brings to light here, and what forms and practices transnational solidarity could take. For this, the workshop offers you networking opportunities. The workshop does not require any special prior knowledge. However, the first workshop provides a good knowledge base. For the case studies it would be good to have some knowledge of English.

Title: Mapping intersections of the climate justice struggles and opportunities - departing in the Harbour of Hamburg

Time slot: 10.08., 11:30 - 13 Uhr

Type: Workshop

Restrictions: 30 participants max.

Language: Englisch

Description: In this workshop, we will start by unfolding the concept of Intersectionality of Struggles (Angela Davis) by listening to sound pieces recorded by the radio collective the Bridge Radio (DK). From there, we want to use visual mapping as a tool to understand how the struggles we are part of relates to international struggles for climate justice. As a case, we zoom in on the Harbour of Hamburg. Mapping doesn't always lead to the creation of a "map", instead we will approach mapping as a way to develop ideas and as a process to think collectively. Using our reflections and inputs from the day, we will assemble a collective visual piece. In the process we will trace the relations between places/people/histories. Our idea is that the mapping exercise will make obvious the oppression related to the Harbour of Hamburg, but also the counter movements for justice. Why we hope that the exercise opens up for ideas for actions between struggles and for envisioning new alliances.

Title: "Introduction to the Critique of Logistics - Logistics and Climate Crisis - Building The Fossil Factory."

Description: Like in a fever dream, capitalism keeps everything in motion - everywhere, all the time. Before we can marvel at the immense collection of goods on the shelves, all the individual parts have traveled immense distances. Since its inception, capitalist profit logic has sought the global organization and expansion of production. This principle began violently with colonial raids and the transatlantic slave trade. Within a short time, capitalism has transformed the entire earth into a fossil factory. Waterways, railways and roads connect raw material extraction, production and sales markets. This link is logistics.

If we look at the capitalist mode of production from its comprehensive reproduction, then the infrastructure of this reproduction is logistics. In our workshop we want to look with you at what is commonly considered logistical

infrastructure: container terminals, ports and airports, warehouses, oil pipelines and deep sea data cables. Where has the so-called logistics revolution led? What does "containerization" mean and what does "just-in-time" production mean? And why is the "global fossil factory" an equally global offensive against international workers?

Title: COP27. how Germany is complicit in the greenwashing of Egypt's military dictatorship.

Timeslot: 10.08 11:30 a.m. - 1 p.m.

Languages: English and German

Description: in November 2022 Egypt will host the COP27. We want to say loud and clear that we refuse to use the COP27 and the struggle for climate justice to cover up the crimes of the Egyptian regime. In this workshop, we will talk about the struggle for human rights and environmental activism in Egypt and explore ways we can use COP27 as a tool to put pressure on the Egyptian regime instead of whitewashing its atrocities.

Title: "Privilege Move/Walk"

Time slot: Aug. 10, 2:30-4 p.m.

Restriction: 100 people max.

Description: The left scene should be a place that is accessible for all people but the reality is different. Whether it is a house project or youth antifa, many groups are dominated by white, abled and much privileged people from academic families. It has been said for ages that something has to change, that marginalized people should get better access to our structures. The first step towards creating truly low barrier spaces is to recognize the power relations in our structures. With the method Privilege move (often called privilege walk) we want to spatially illustrate how privileges are distributed on the camp and give individuals the opportunity to acknowledge and reflect on their position.

Title: "Solidarity will win! - It's all a question of organizing"

Description: Where does the climate justice movement stand today? What is left of our structures after two and a half years of pandemic? Decay and fraying are increasing, the number of active local climate groups and the amount of actions are decreasing. We seem to be facing the big challenge of having to develop new strategies and reorganize, while the climate crisis is accelerating rapidly and we actually have no time to lose. What does this mean for our organizing and practice at the local group level? How do we get dormant group processes going again and how do we build new groups? We would like to discuss this with you, based on your own practical experiences.

Title: "Women's Revolution in Northern and Eastern Syria".

Time slot: Aug. 10, 2:30 - 4 p.m.

Type: Lecture and discussion

Organization: Women Defend Rojava

Language: German

Description: In Northern and Eastern Syria, a grassroots democratic project is being built since 2012, which ideologically refers to the Kurdish freedom movement. The guiding idea of this is the concept of Democratic Confederalism, which is based on gender justice, grassroots democracy and ecology. The process of social transformation is also referred to as the women's revolution. But what constitutes it? A delegation of "Gemeinsam kämpfen" (Fighting Together) conducted interviews with women who answer this question from their perspective and describe the implementation of the women's revolution in practice. Central in their narratives is the lived resistance, not only against military attacks on the region, but also against patriarchal structures in society. They tell of organizing in councils, building an alternative economy, and why this requires autonomous, feminist organizing. Their practice shows a global perspective beyond state, power and patriarchy.

How can we who work for climate justice continue to communicate to the outside world that the good life is possible for all, while resignation, fear, and exhaustion overwhelm some of us? And who or what are we actually hoping for?

Description: "Do you want people to freeze in winter?" - that's how many people's reactions turn out when we take to the streets today against the construction of the LNG terminals. Playing off social crises against environmental crises is a popular tool of politics and yet many people's concerns are real. Gas prices are already rising for consumers, in some cases by 300%, and the question is who will be able to pay for it in the future. Those who already have too little are the ones who suffer most from rising gas prices. But what does

this mean for us as a climate justice movement? How can we think social and ecological crises together and open up an anti-capitalist perspective in solidarity? Which industries currently consume how much gas and what role do LNG terminals play in short-term crisis management? We want to gather facts, discuss them together and make plans how we as social movements can position ourselves for the fall and winter.

Description: Almost all current climate scenarios assume further economic growth, globally, until 2100 - this has reasons and consequences. In the workshop we will deal with both and look at the Societal Transformation Scenario as an alternative.

Description: When was the last time you were really angry? What is our relationship to anger? When is anger empowering, when does it seem destructive? Who is allowed to be angry and who is not? What role does anger play in activism? Do we give anger enough space? And is the climate justice movement angry enough? In the workshop we want to talk with you about anger in the context of climate justice. We will shed light on political as well as psychological perspectives and work out personal reflection impulses. Our open-ended exchange will provide space for political discussion as well as personal exchange of experiences in dealing with anger.

Title: "Transformative Justice in cases of sexualized violence."

Time slot: Aug. 11, 9:30 a.m. - 12h30 a.m.

Name of the group: Ende Gelände contact group in cases of sexualized violence

Type: Workshop

Language: English

Description: When sexualized violence is named in the own left circles, most environments react with internalized behavior of "Rape Culture", which structurally trivializes this form of interpersonal violence and blames victims for the experience (Victim Blaming). We ask ourselves how we can put an anti-sexist, emancipatory and intersectional claim into practice in such cases. Concepts like Transformative Justice & Community Accountability can become important and helpful points of reference. The workshop is divided into two parts: the 1st part (approx. 1 hr.) will provide a theoretical basis, in order to deepen the concepts and approaches in the 2nd part (approx. 1.5 hrs.) and to ask about lived practice. Interested people can also come to the 1st part only.

Title: "System Change through anticolonial organizing: Debt for Climate".

Description: Debt is an extremely powerful tool of colonialism and an essential driving force of extractivism. Yet most of the climate movements in the Global North are shying away from this topic due to its designed complexity, and thus remain ignorant of one of the major pillars of global inequalities. It's time to overcome the fear of finance colonialism and organize globally to cancel the debt of Most Affected People and Areas, which is the Global North's knee on the neck of the Global South. Learn about Debt for Climate, a global grassroots initiative, uniting labor, indigenous rights, and climate movements to make the Global North pay its historic climate debt by cancelling the financial debts of the Global South.

Title: Indigenous struggles for water and life in Mexico - a report.

Description: The Caravan for Water and Life traveled through a total of 9 states in Mexico from March 22-April 26, 2022 as a protest march against capitalist exploitation and destruction. In doing so, it drew attention to various organizations and indigenous collectives fighting for the protection of water and the right to life. We - activists of Lützerath lives from the lignite resistance in the Rhineland - were invited and accompanied the caravan in Mexico. In a lecture we want to tell you about our experiences, present the caravan and some indigenous initiatives in particular. One focus will be on our learnings through the participation in the caravan. Together with you we want to discuss what we have learned and look for strategies to connect climate justice struggles worldwide.

Description: In a resolution passed by an overwhelming majority (only 7 abstentions), the UN General Assembly classified the right to a clean environment as a human right in its own right on July 28, 2022. This is indeed a milestone, but also historically revolutionary. "The resolution will help reduce environmental injustices, close gaps in protection and empower people, especially those in vulnerable situations such as defenders of environmental human rights, children, youth, women and indigenous peoples," said UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres. But the resolution is not legally binding. How can the obligations of this resolution under international law be implemented? This is what Peter Emorinken-Donatus will be talking about in his presentation on the "Ecocide Gesture" solution approach, also in connection with the concept of "Loss, Damage and Restorative Justice". The 56-year-old Nigerian journalist, education consultant, environmental activist and long-time opponent of the Shell corporation was born in Nigeria, but has lived in Germany for over 30 years. He is co-initiator and ex-chairman of the board of the movement "Pay Day Africa", one of the spokespersons of the "African / Black Community (ABC) Germany" as well as the "Committee for an African Memorial in Berlin (KADiB)". In addition, he is also co-founder and spokesperson of the movement "Bündnis Ökozidgesetz", which was founded with the aim of criminalizing ecocide (the most serious environmental crimes).

Militarization is back. And it has come to stay, and to fundamentally change our society. According to the governing parties and many media, rearmament is the answer without alternative to the current conditions - a moral-ethical necessity, the only honest expression of solidarity. Anyone who rejects it or even questions it is denigrated, takes sides with Russia or is ignorant and unworldly. It's the same as always: there is only friend and enemy, black and white, criticism is treason. It is not easy to be against war once it has actually started. In reality, militarization stands for what it has always stood for: suffering and misery for large parts of the population. Militarization intervenes deeply in our society. In doing so, it can connect to patriarchy. Men are forced into a fighting "heroic" role on the front lines, and women are forced into a vulnerable, pitiful position. The Ukrainian state makes this a state doctrine by refusing to allow deserters or conscientious objectors to leave the country or by putting them in jail. Those who are allowed to flee Ukraine are welcomed into the EU. As long as they are white people who fit the gender norms. Everyone else still experiences harassment, illegal push-backs, danger to life at the external borders. So does everyone else who has fled the "wrong wars." Who sit in internment camps,

freeze to death at borders, drown in the the Mediterranean. And the breakout from the fossil economy is also becoming a distant prospect - it is being sacrificed to the logic of intensifying competition. Fracking in Germany and liquefied gas from the dictatorships of the Middle East, restarting coal-fired power plants and extending nuclear power plant lifetimes - nothing is currently unthinkable. That's why Rheinmetall Disarm goes to the city that stands for the continuity of German arms production like no other: Kassel. Not least because of this, it was almost completely destroyed in the Second World War, and yet armaments production still takes place in its center, and the transport of tanks is part of the everyday street scene.

Description: "The world's leading climate scientists are now ringing the alarm

bell at a deafening loudness, because the remaining time to act is almost over - but it is as if the frequency of the bell's sound is beyond the threshold of human hearing."

(Clive Hamilton, "Requiem for a Species") This prevailing "deafness" has little to do with ignorance - but a lot to do with stubborn psychological blockages to let what has long been known also be felt, and in close connection with this also with a strong paralysis of the readiness and hopefulness of political action.

In our workshop we want to be guided by three important clues in order to look for ways out of the political and psychological paralysis (working behind the facade of an apparent deafness) - and thus also to sound out chances for a more successful climate movement:

1.) A view of the existential threats of the climate crisis that is as illusionless as possible, in order to be able to throw everything in our power into the balance against it as decisively and deliberately as possible - i.e. a clear break with the "positive thinking" of capitalist consumer indulgence, as Greta Thunberg so aptly demands: "I want you to panic.... I want you to act as if our house is on fire. Because it is."

2.) A most consistent orientation of the climate movement towards international solidarity, social justice and inclusivity for all (racially, neo-colonially, economically, socially...) discriminated and oppressed groups on earth - as also demanded by Tonny, Miriam and Esteban, among others, at the Action Conference on July 10, 2022.

3.) The crucial importance of opportunities and places where people can exchange their own feelings about the climate crisis in a trusting way - which will be exemplified by the experiences and reflections on a discussion group meeting regularly in 2019.

Title: "Transformative Justice in cases of sexualized violence."

Description: When sexualized violence is named in the own left circles, most environments react with internalized behavior of "Rape Culture", which structurally trivializes this form of interpersonal violence and blames victims for the experience (Victim Blaming). Concepts like Transformative Justice & Community Accountability can become important and helpful points of reference.
